## Lifting the ban on Ship Security Officer's course

## Training Circular No. 09 of 2011

## **Subject: Lifting the ban on Ship Security Officer's course**

The issue of new approvals/increase in intake of Ship Security Officer's course has been examined in detail by the Committee constituted for this purpose. Considering that new courses viz. "Security Awareness course [SAC]" and "Security Training for Designated Person [STDP]" are required to be introduced according to the STCW'95 Manila 2010 Amendments, and STDP being the mandatory course, the said Committee has recommended for lifting of the ban on new approvals/increase in intake of the Ship Security Officer's course subject to certain conditions.

As per the recommendations of the Committee, in continuation of the <u>Training Circular No.5 of 2007</u> dated 23.08.2007 & in continuation of <u>M.S. Notice No.15 of 2003</u> dated 19.06.2003, <u>Training Circular No.34 of 2004</u> dated 7.12.2004, <u>M.S. Notice No.20 of 2003</u> dated 18.08.2003, <u>M.S. Notice No.32 of 2003</u> dated 24.11.2003, and in supersession of <u>M.S. Notice No.2 of 2004</u> dated 15.03.2004, the Director General of Shipping & Ex-Officio Additional Secretary to the Govt. of India, has decided to lift the ban on the new approvals/increase in intake of Ship Security Officers [SSO] course, subject to following conditions

The proposals for new approvals/increase in intake of the SSO course from only those maritime training institutes who are conducting management level competency courses for more than 1 year's duration, will be processed.

The faculty team should include one visiting faculty of officer level rank, as an expert from Navy, NSG, Coast Guard, Army, BSF, etc. who would teach topic 5 & 7 of Annex II of Training Circular No.34 of 2004.

All the existing approved institutes are required to comply with the faculty requirement as mentioned at para 2(ii) above
